The Sidewalks and Walkways Committee ("Walkable Wallingford") was established by the Nether Providence Township Supervisors in June 2007. Our purpose was to review the need for and the benefits and feasibility of improved sidewalks and walking routes and to make recommendations for action. In the past year, this volunteer committee inventoried all existing routes; collected information from key stakeholders such as the township police, the schools, PennDOT, and others; researched opportunities and solutions used by other municipalities; and developed a website and updated it frequently.

Perhaps most important, we conducted a survey of township residents to identify where they felt there were issues about and opportunities for walkability. We held a public workshop on April 2, 2008 to present the information we had gathered to that point and to hear more about the thoughts of township residents. In June, we held a second workshop to present our preliminary recommendations for discussion. Participation by township residents in the survey and workshops was very valuable in helping us to understand the issues more clearly and to make precise recommendations.

The result of this work is a *Proposal for Sidewalks and Safe Routes*. It synthesizes the needs demonstrated in the survey to establish key destinations. The area of our community cited by most respondents as their key destination is the triangle formed by the Wawa and Library on one corner, Wallingford Elementary School on the second, and the Wallingford Train Station on the third. The Strath Haven High School-Middle School complex is a key community destination for both school children and the community at large when taking part in the recreational and cultural activities of our schools.

The Media borough area - including the Acme, the Media business district, and transportation nodes such as the trolley stop - is the third most cited destination. Swarthmore, including the Swarthmore Woods shopping area, is the fourth.

Using these logical and well-defined destinations, the committee established priorities to create sidewalks and safe routes for our community. We found that other highly favored destinations are also well served by the sidewalks and interventions needed to link the primary destinations. Schools, swim clubs, parks, and places of worship all become more accessible with the infrastructure we propose.

In addition to sidewalks, we propose other steps including refuge islands at dangerous intersections and traffic calming. Some problems will require more dramatic assessment and interventions, requiring expertise beyond the talents of the Committee. Others may be addressed through education and enforcement of existing laws and codes.

While specific funding opportunities may be more applicable to some items than others, the priorities summarized below provide a blueprint for a safer, more accessible community. This is a plan that the Board of Commissioners may use to explore and set funding priorities, many of which will require that a plan be in place before the Township may apply for the funding.

The committee unanimously recommends adoption of this Proposal for Sidewalks and Safe Routes by the Board of Commissioners.

Whereas the Township's adoption of the Proposal for Sidewalks and Safe Routes can serve as a guideline for future development and acquisition of funding, therefore

- Providence Road from Wallingford Avenue to Copples Lane

- Wallingford Avenue
- Providence Road from Copples Lane to Chester Road
- Manchester Avenue from the Pennsylvania Institute of Technology to Radnor Street
- West Rose Valley Road from Brookhaven Road to Providence Road
- Moore Road from Brookhaven Road to Media Parkway to Devon Lane
- Chester Road from Providence Road to the bridge over the Blue Route
- Beatty Road from Baltimore Pike to Penn Valley Road
- Brookhaven Road from West Rose Valley Road to Avondale Road
