Project Summary

- A walkway will be installed along the north side (westbound) of East Rose Valley Road from Providence Road to Osborne Lane.
- The project construction is being funded through the PA Department of Community and Economic Development's Multimodal Transportation Fund.
- The walkway will be macadam (asphalt) with concrete ADA ramps, crosswalks, and pedestrian signal improvements.

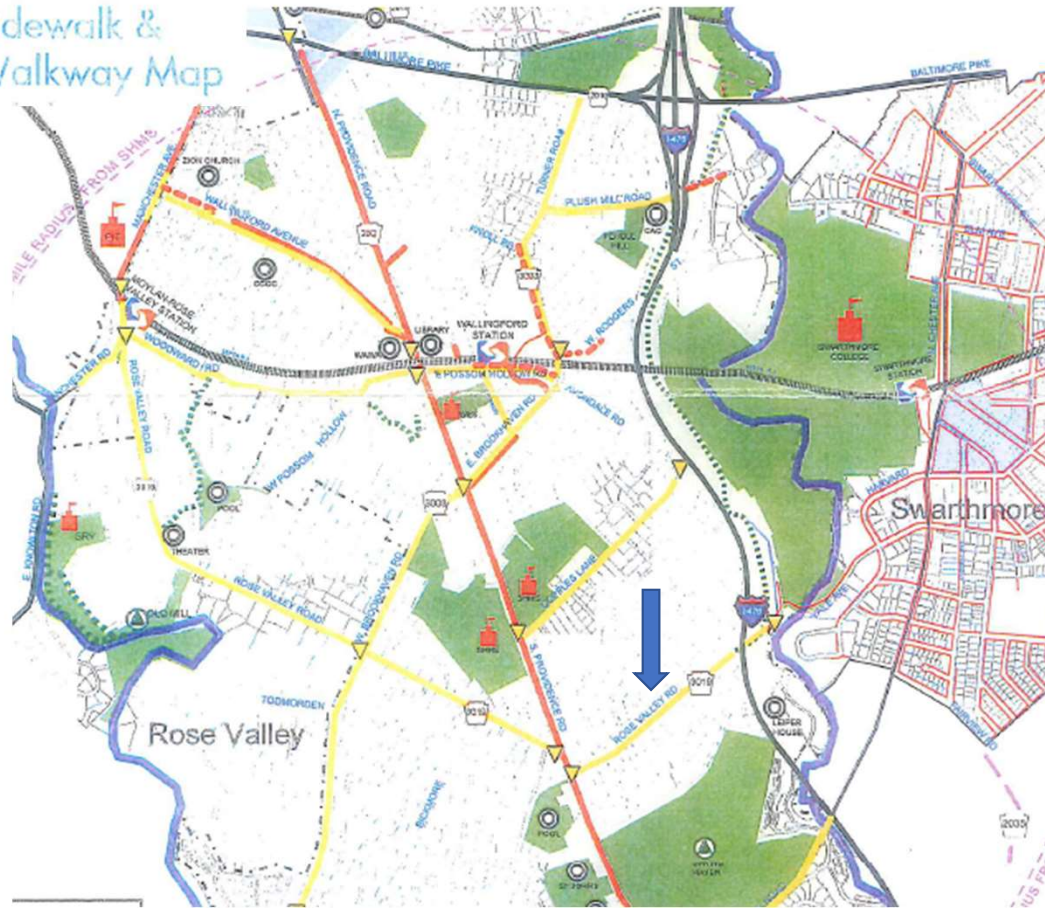

Project History

- The project need was identified through a Walkable Wallingford Study that was performed in 2008, which was completed by residents within the Township.
- The Board of Commissioners voted to apply for grant funding from the DCED to accomplish the project. The DCED offered its support in the form of the grant.
- The Temple Department of Planning and Community Development also identified it as a dangerous gap in the walkway network.

 - The Leiper Smedley Trail

 - The Wallingford Swim Club
 - The Springhaven Country Club
 - Swarthmore Borough
