Welcome to Our New Newsletter

Dear Residents.

As I sit down to draft an update, I see that my summer 2024 update began with a recognition that quite a lot of road and utility work was going on around town. Unfortunately, we have been in a similar situation recently. While it can be very disruptive, on the bright side, we will have upgraded utilities and freshly paved roads when the work is complete. We appreciate everyone's patience in the meantime.

Please get out and enjoy our parks. We have been able to make so many improvements over the last year. Gouley received a brand new turf field, the lower sports court at Sapovits was expanded and improved and the softball field was upgraded as well, Martha Burton saw a total overhaul with a new playground and many other improvements, new dugouts were installed at Hepford, the new walking trail and bridge at Furness were completed, and the Leiper-Smedley trail was resurfaced and widened consistent with ADA guidelines. We continue to apply for grant funding and look forward to installing another set of dugouts at Hepford and a set at Bullens in the coming months, starting trail work at Houston, installing a walking path at Martha Burton, planning a path from the Grandview neighborhood to Gouley, as well as adding landscaping around the new trail at Furness.

Representative Krueger, Senator Kane, and County Council continue to support the Township and have been instrumental in helping us secure grant funding to complete the parks projects mentioned above, as well as stormwater projects, and expanding our network of sidewalks. We are thrilled with how the sidewalk along Providence Road between Copples Lane and E. Rose Valley Road has turned out. Funding has been secured to install sidewalk from the intersection of 320 up to Waterford Way, as well as from E. Rose Valley Road to Putters Lane, and we continue to work to secure funding to close the gap between Waterford Way and Putters Lane in the near future.

Please get out and enjoy all that Nether Providence has to offer!

CELEBRATING SUMMER WITH OUR WONDERFUL BACKYARD BIRDS!!

We are truly fortunate to live in a community and region that has a wealth of enchanting songbirds. Here are some tips to help keep our yards a haven for them:

- Provide native seed-bearing perennial flowers, such as coneflowers, asters and goldenrods, and keep the seedheads intact after the flowers bloom. You can then watch feisty goldfinches and other birds feast on these plant seeds!**
- Consider adding native berry-producing shrubs, including blueberries, hollies (including winterberry hollies), viburnums and American beautyberry. Delightful catbirds, robins and cardinals rely on these fruits for food. Shrubs also provide needed songbird shelter.
- Keep cats indoors. (Sadly, cats are estimated to kill 2.4 billion birds each year in the U.S.)
- If providing a bird bath, clean it regularly and ensure water is fresh (clean out at least every three days, to prevent mosquito larvae from growing).

- Avoid pesticide use. Birds depend on a food supply of caterpillars and insects, but pesticides can destroy that essential food.
- Instead, thank those mosquito-eating birds, such as chickadees, wrens and warblers, that each can consume thousands of insects every day, including mosquitoes!
- And maybe you are fortunate enough to have hummingbirds in your yard. Those amazing and delightful 'hummers' can zoom around and eat thousands of mosquitoes and other insects each day! They also get nectar from flowers that are tubular and red, such as native honeysuckle vine, red lobelia and salvias. If using a hummer feeder, it's best to change it daily in the hot summer days. Hummers also appreciate a water mist.
- Apply bird-friendly decals to windows to prevent lethal bird strikes.

Hopefully these tips will help you sit back in the summer heat and enjoy the wonderful birds that bring joyous songs and beauty to the haven you have provided in your yard.

Furness Park

Martha Burton Community Park

A walking path around the perimeter, lighting, and a picnic grove will be installed.

Bullens

Dugouts will be installed on our Rookie field thanks to County funding.

Sapovits

Expansion and resurfacing of the lower, multi-sport court and parking improvements along Prichard Lane will be completed this summer.

Township Building

Grant funding has been secured for installation of an elevator to allow for barrier- free access to the 2nd floor Meeting Room as well as window replacements and a new roof.

Henry Lane

Installation of storm drains on portions of Henry Lane are being completed in the spring, and we are looking for additional grant funding to complete work on the remainder of the street.

Gouley Park

In addition to the improvements on the field, Scout Maxim Kurchan built benches along the top of the parking lot hill and constructed stairs leading from the upper parking lot.

PUBLIC WORKS

LEAF MULCH ORDERS =

The Township leaf mulch program runs from the end of March until June (or whenever the mulch runs out). Orders are taken at the Township Building at 214 Sykes Lane, Monday – Friday 9:00AM – 5:00PM. No orders will be taken over the phone. Check or Cash only.

Township Resident - \$105.00/full truck load or \$65.00/half truck load **Non-resident** - \$130.00/ full truck load or \$90.00/half truck load Full Truck load covers about 5-6 yards; Half truck load covers about 2-3 yards.



YARD WASTE ≡

The Township Public Works Department collects yard waste on the **second Tuesday of each month.**

You MUST call the Township to get on the list to have your yard waste picked up.

Simply call 610-566- 4516 Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. and provide your address.

Call early as pick-ups can fill up!

- Limbs and branches must not be greater than 4" in diameter and no longer than 5'. They should be bundled together with twine.
- All items must be placed at the edge of your property, curbside. The employees cannot come onto your property to pick up the items.
- If you choose to bag items, they must be in a paper biodegradable bag. NO PLASTIC BAGS OR PLASTIC BIODEGRADABLE BAGS.
- Logs, stumps, and branches larger than the parameters above WILL NOT be collected. You'll have to arrange for a tree company or your trash hauler to take those items.

NOT accepted: Grass clippings, vines, ivy, and weeds. These clog and break the mulch machines.

Drop-offs will be permitted from 8 a.m. to noon on the first Saturday of the month and Monday - Friday from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. each week at the Township public works garage located at 5 W. Brookhaven Road, Wallingford.

New Small E-waste Collection Container

Nether Providence Township is excited to announce a new small e-recycling service for residents with drop-offs on Monday and Friday from 8:00 am -2:00 pm and the first Saturday of the month from 8:00 am-noon.

Located at 5 W Brookhaven Rd in the **Public Works recycling area**



NPT has expanded its partnership with PAR-Recycle Works to add this new service in addition to our annual E-recycle/shredding event. PAR recycling is a non-profit electronics recycler that provides employment and services to people returning from prison. This container is for any small and medium-sized items with a plug or wire. The items must fit & cannot be left outside the container.

PAR recycling is R2-RIOS certified. Which means the R2v3 recycling results in zero landfill destination for e-waste and provides a common set of processes, safety measures and documentation requirements for businesses that repair and recycle used electronics. PUBLIC SAFETY



Officer Michael Worrell

Police Chief David Splain welcomed two new officers and recognized a veteran officer who stepped into a new role of leadership and responsibility in the Nether Providence Township Police Department.

Officer Michael Worrell was promoted to sergeant, joining Sgts. Michael Montgomery, Michael Markunas and Matthew Liss in supervisory roles.

With his daughter Layla, 11, holding the Bible and his girlfriend Kara Schroeder seated in the audience, Sgt. Worrell was sworn in by Magisterial District Judge Elizabeth Gallard, reciting his oath before a group of well-wishers at the Jan. 9, 2025, monthly Board of Commissioners meeting.

Sgt. Worrell is an 11-year law enforcement veteran, serving the last eight as a full-time NPPD patrol officer. He is also a part-time Sergeant First Class/Platoon Sergeant with the Army National Guard, of which he has been a member for over 15 years.

The son of the late Scott Worrell and Maria Vitello, Sgt. Worrell has lived in Delaware County his entire life. He graduated from Academy Park High School and, more recently, earned a B.S. in criminal justice, military studies, and business from Liberty University, graduating with the highest honors.

Sgt. Worrell has described being a police officer as his dream job. When he was told at the age of 18 that he would not be hired by any police department until he was 21, he decided to join the U.S. Army.

"I joined the Army and almost immediately was sent to Afghanistan where I served for a year from November 2010 to 2011. I came home and went to the police academy," he recalled. When he graduated from the academy's six-month program in 2012, he was the recipient of the Firearms Award.

In 2013, Sgt. Worrell was hired as a part-time officer in Yeadon, where Chief Splain was then a detective sergeant. Sgt. Worrell came to work as a part-time officer in Nether Providence in 2014 under Splain, who had been hired as NPPD chief in 2013.

Sgt. Worrell later worked full-time for both the Drexel University Police Department and then the Philadelphia Police Department before returning full-time to Nether Providence in November 2016.

At NPPD, Sgt. Worrell has consistently demonstrated a commitment to this department and this community, Chief Splain said. In addition to his patrol duties, he is a field training officer, and firearms instructor/armorer. He is also a member of the Central Delco Tactical Response Team.

"Since I was 18, I wanted to be a police officer. I grew up seeing kids making poor choices, and I wanted to become part of the change," Sgt. Worrell has previously stated.

On March 14, 2025, Officers Andrew Yates and James MacIntosh joined the NPPD patrol division. Yates' mother, Michele, and MacIntosh's wife, Emily, held the Bible as they were sworn in by District Judge Gallard before an audience packed with family, friends and fellow law enforcement officers.

"It is an honor to introduce our two newest full-time officers," Chief Splain said. "They recently participated in a highly competitive selection process, emerging as

the top candidates among a pool of applicants."

Officer Yates, 23, has been working as a part-time officer for the NPPD since September 2024. A lifelong resident of Nether Providence, he graduated from Strath Haven High School in 2019 and earned a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Widener University in 2023 - all the while perfecting his baseball provess.

Officer Yates began his law enforcement career in July 2024 when he was hired as a part-time officer in Glenolden, shortly after graduating from the Delaware County Municipal Police Academy.

"Andrew has done an outstanding job in his eight months with the department," Chief Splain said. "It is my honor to have Andrew as a full-time member of the Nether Providence Police Department."

Officer MacIntosh, 33, resides in Swarthmore. He graduated from Monsignor Bonner High School in 2009 and earned a bachelor's degree in Sociology from Widener University in 2014. Following graduation, he enrolled in the county police academy. In 2015, he was hired as a part-time officer by the Collingdale Police Department. By 2018, he had been promoted to a full-time position, and a year later, he was assigned to the detective division.

"Jim comes to us with excellent recommendations. He is highly trained and has a wealth of experience," Chief Splain said.





tips for stormwater management on your property


DID YOU KNOW:

- Yard debris, including leaves and other organic plant material like shrubbery trimmings and grass clippings, are a significant source of stormwater pollution. This debris can clog culverts, storm drains, and pipes, causing flooding.
- Debris can carry fertilizers and pesticides from your yard and deposit them in streams and ponds.
- Piles of leaves and grass clippings will overload a stream's ability to process leaf litter, causing nutrient pollution and oxygen depletion.


It is easy to do your part to protect our streams and the drainage systems leading to our waterways:



Do not pile leaves or other yard waste near streams or drainage channels where they can blow or wash into creeks. Use designated leaf collection bags for curbside leaf recycling.









Compost leaves and grass clippings along with yard waste. Select a location removed from streams, ponds, and wetlands.


